Bikes galore at affordable prices

IF YOU, or someone you know, would love a good quality reconditioned bike for a Christmas present (especially children), in return for a small donation, then the volunteers at the Blackwood Community Bike Shed would love to help you.

The Bike Shed, which was previously located in Belair for many



years, are now in larger premises after shifting to the grounds of the Blackwood Uniting Church, near the roundabout.

Their sheds are currently full of bikes (from mountain bikes to BMX to road bikes - both for adults and children), some of which have been repaired and reconditioned to be in a near new condition.

"We simply don't have any more room to store all the donated bikes that we have stripped and rebuilt," said Peter Jones, Community Bike Shed spokesperson.

"The bikes are free, however, if you can make a small donation to the church which in turn goes towards purchasing more spare parts to repair the bikes, it would be appreciated," explained Peter.

The Community Bike Shed is located behind the Blackwood Uniting Church near the roundabout, and is open each Monday from 9am to 12noon.

So come along any Monday morning if you could use a good quality reconditioned bike as a Christmas present for someone; or if you have a bike that you are no longer using that could go to a good home.

It's a great community project that also prevents many bikes ending up as landfill.

Help struggling families with Xmas hamper donation

YOU can make a difference to one disadvantaged family this Christmas by making a donation of goods to the newly resurrected 'Beacon 24' program.

This project assists families struggling with the rising cost of living around the Blackwood area, and has brought the 'Beacon' emergency relief service back to better meet the needs of the community.

Local pharmacist, Tracey Yeend from The Green Dispensary in Blackwood, began hearing of people in the community who were struggling, and decided there was an urgent need for a community assistance program.

"I started noticing a couple of people coming into the pharmacy not being able to pay for their medication," Tracey said. "Through chatting with them, I found that they were struggling even purchasing food. From that, I started a conversation with local MP for Waite, Catherine Hutchesson, and we brought together the Blackwood Church of Christ and Blackwood Lions to discuss what could be done to help."

Through this initial meeting, it was discovered that 130 families had asked for food help that week in the Blackwood area.

"We will provide a family, food for 24 hours and a pathway to find additional help," explained Tracey.

"We have devised quite a specific list (see on right) so we don't get random stuff donated, and the beauty of this, is it is not going to be just a Church of Christ initiative anymore. We are bringing many community groups in the area to join together to make this successful.

"We will still be using the Church of Christ as a base where Beacon was before, and fortunately, they haven't done anything to alter the storage room since the former service was aloged "Tracay spid

Increasing main road housing density by James Swanborough will benefit community

AMIDST ongoing developments to the Blackwood centre, a confidential meeting was held by Mitcham Council last month, to discuss expressions of interest from prospective developers to the former Blackwood Library and Karkoo Nursery sites.

The sale of the sites on Main Road, Blackwood was tied into the financing for the new Blackwood Community Library and Hub (Tiwu Kumangka).

The site is listed as a "substantial mixed-use development site within the Urban Corridor (Living) zone providing for multi-level, mixed-use development supporting residential and compatible non-residential uses.

Mitcham Council have stated that in seeking a preferred purchaser, it will favour proposals which deliver a multi-level mixed use development, including an activated main road frontage which comprises multiple commercial tenancies, and featuring a range of apartment sizes and choices including affordable housing, and high quality, sustainable design outcomes.

Single use, big box developments have explicitly been discouraged from applying.

Mitcham Mayor, Dr Heather Holmes-Ross stated that the Council were seeking a high standard for development.

"What is worth noting, is that there is a broad criteria that we are looking to be answered, but if we can't find a suitable buyer to meet our vision, then the sale will not go ahead," said Heather.

"We have agreed as a council on a strategic plan for the city, which identifies growth areas and areas which we want to retain. We have agreed to increase density around transport and retail hubs, so that we can minimise the effects in the suburbs.

"Putting high density living in those places allows us to maintain lower density in other areas, which we believe is important in retaining the intrinsic character which gives our residents a good quality of life."

State Government planning reforms for new developments have meant significant changes are beginning to take place in terms of the height and types of buildings being constructed in urban and suburban areas.

"Rezoning allows us to go higher than we could have in the past. From our point of view, we have to increase density, we are required to do that by the State Government," explained Heather.

"We feel the best place to have that density is around the transport hub and business precinct. By increasing density along the main road, we hope that will slow or halt an increase in density in the surrounding suburban areas.

"We want to provide housing diversity, in particular for older members of our community looking to downsize and live in very close proximity to the Blackwood precinct. There are many people in the community who have raised their families here, who are getting to an age where they want a downsize, and don't want to be reliant on driving to get to the shops. So, we are trying to provide that for our community."

Local resident Andrew Tidswell's background as an architect, led him to have some concern regarding the potential for developers to take advantage of the site, and fail to fulfill a vision in keeping with the innate character of Blackwood.

"The risk is that developers might claim to meet the crieria, but in the end deliver something much less," he said. " [The lack of detail in the EOA means] there are no criteria against which to judge the proposals."

Andrew claims that developers regularly try to exceed planning and height limit requirements. "This is their business model to maximise profit; which is fair enough," he said, "but it is Council's business to ensure appropriate quality outcomes for the community now and into the future.

"This is a prime site and will most likely deliver the largest building in the Blackwood district. This is a unique opportunity to have something that will benefit all of our community and the Council is on notice to get it done right," added Andrew.

Meanwhile, Peter Rowat, co-owner of *Karkoo Nursery*, who currently occupies a portion of the sale site, is currently on a short-term lease, requiring 2-3 months notice for termination. Peter said he did not see the likelihood of moving out anytime soon.

"Whoever buys it, will have to go through the standard development process, so it could still take some time," said Peter.

"When I spoke to our agent, he said he thought we would still be here for another 12-18 months after it's been sold. The plans will need to get architectural approval and it all takes time, so I'm sure they will be happy to receive rent until building can start."

At time of of writing, no formal announcement had been made as to the prospective developer of the site. \Box

1950s 'snapshot' of life in the Mitcham Hills



This year, the Blackwood Action Group History team is using the monthly headlines from the 1955 editions of the 'Coromandel Newspaper' to provide readers with a 'snapshot' of life during the 1950s ...

First Blackwood Christmas Tree Festival launched in 1960



THE Blackwood Branch of the Country Women's Association presented the first 'Blackwood Christmas Tree Festival' in 1960.

It must have been a popular idea as 135 entries were received, TV coverage occurred and the event was opened by Lady Playford – wife of the then Premier, Sir Thomas Playford.

Held in the Blackwood Memorial Hall on Coromandel Parade around 1,400 adults and children attended over the 3 days of the festival. Prize money was made available by local businesses with proceeds going to charity and the Blackwood Memorial Hall Fund.

Within a few years, a tradition had begun with the Blackwood Christmas Pageant ending at the Memorial Hall, and Santa leaving his sleigh to take up residence in a specially built Magic Cave amongst the trees.

The community enjoyed not only a magnificent spectacle of decorated trees but also decorated bottles (a 1962 Blackwood Golf Club entry featured nuts, bolts, washers and things all gilded and glued), table centrepieces (1964 saw a white lace stocking with baubles and streamers), hostess aprons, mantlepiece decorations, wreaths, floral arrangements and mobiles. Christmas cards, designed by renowned Blackwood artist Ainsley Roberts, were also on sale.

1960s festivities also included dog parades, morning teas, choir boys, a train line, model cars and decorated cakes with

Janet Adamson crowned Queen of the Festival.

But it was the trees that were the feature, and 1960s exhibits certainly seemed creative! An artificial tree decorated with ping pong balls, a tree made from a bamboo rake and a tree created from a cone covered with rosettes made from tinted tissues called 'Christmas in the bathroom' all being part of the fun.

Many exhibits were described as 'unbelievably beautiful... Traditional trees laden with bright and lovely ornaments and gaily lit' and spectacular trees using natural Australian vegetation have featured.

Lesleyann Fairbrother recalls we 'first using Epsom Salts

around the trees for snow, then Mum had a contact with Iplex Plastics and we were able to get plastic off cuts'. (1967).

Entrants came from Schools, Floral Art Clubs, the Labour Council, Wanda Boys Home, Apex and Lions Clubs, Girl Guides, the Good Neighbour Counsel and many creative individual community members. 'For many... the exhibits represent a whole year's work, the fulfilment of a dream, an idea brought to life...' (1972)

In 1973, the Blackwood Apex Club took over the management of the festival bringing their own ideas to the event. *"...stalls* will include cold drinks, ice cream, a barbecue..., fairy floss and donuts. A merry-go-round will also be available. Christmas carols will be sung by visiting choirs and Christmas music will be played by courtesy of Blackwood Sound Centre... an art and craft fair will feature...' (Hills Gazette, 1 Dec 1976).

Perhaps the volunteers became exhausted as the festival ceased in 1980. After a lull of some 36 years, the festival was reignited by the Blackwood Action Group, and today is a much enjoyed bi-annual community event.

Two life time goals achieved by thriller author



"DURING the tough times of 2020, when I was looking for a way to steer myself through the uncertainty of Coivd, I made two long-term life goals," said Eden Hills resident Ms Mercedes Mercier.

"The first was to become a published author, and the second, to buy a house in the hills community that I grew up in. Little did I know that I would achieve both those goals the following year!!"

Early in 2021, Mercedes got the phone call that all aspiring authors dream of: a major publisher, HarperCollins Australia, were offering her a two-book deal.

"My first novel, *White Noise*, was published in 2022 and my follow-up, *Black Lies*, was published this year.

"My novels are standalone thrillers that feature my main character, Dr Laura Fleming, who is a criminal psychologist," explained Mercedes, who has a background spanning a decade of work in the criminal justice system, which has provided a strong foundation for her books.

"As it turned out, my second goal came more quickly than I expected, too. After eighteen months of looking, we found our dream home in Eden Hills. Having grown up in Coromandel Valley, attending Coro Valley primary school and St John's Grammar, I always knew I wanted to settle here. I spent a few years exploring life on 'the flats', but my heart has always been in the hills."

So as the end of 2023 is drawing closer, Mercedes is writing books three and four with a view of gum trees and kangaroos in her back yard, and the sounds of kookaburras on their back deck.

"My ongoing goals are a bit simpler for the next few years: to keep writing books and to continue to enjoy our home and the wonderful community that I'm so thrilled to be a part of," added Mercedes.

Her books are available locally from *Shakespeare's Bookstore* in Blackwood.

"I'll be doing a couple of signings at Shakespeare's in the lead-up to Christmas, so keep an eye on my social media for dates. I'd love to meet you!"

They're also available in all good bookstores, including Dymocks, QBD, Big W and online at Amazon and Booktopia; plus in libraries across Australia.

Tiwi artists exhibiting at Belair gallery

PAINTINGS by 14 Tiwi artists from Munupi Arts & Crafts are on display at the AIARTS Gallery in Belair.

All the artists use traditional ochres on canvas, and some are award winners who have exhibited in Australia and around the world.

Part of the Tarnanthi Festival, the exhibition will run until 10 December, open on Saturdays and Sundays from 1-5pm.

The Tiwi have lived on the islands over 7,000 years, creating art for ceremonies with totem poles, bark paintings, body paintings. The two main ceremonies are Pukumani funerary ceremony and the Kulama ceremony of fertility and abundance where people dress in elaborate costumes.

The painting images are based on traditional designs from creation stories to ceremonial designs painted on bodies and poles, intricate detailed, beautiful.

The AIARTS Gallery is located at 28 Neate Avenue, Belair and is an exhibition partner to the Art Gallery of SA.

Residents raise concerns at bushfire forums

IT WAS standing room only at the 'Bushfire Resilience Forum' held on October 29 at the Blackwood War Memorial Hall on Coromandel Parade.

Organised by Catherine Hutchesson, Waite MP and her team, in conjunction with Louise Miller-Frost, Federal Member for Boothby; just a touch under 300 people heard from an impressive panel of experts and Government representatives.

Lots of great questions were asked and there was a lot of important information for attendees to take home and digest. Some of the key takeaways were:

- * Have a bushfire plan that says more than 'leave on Catastrophic rated days' – fires can start on 'Extreme' and 'Moderate' days so you need to have a plan that covers what you will do if a fire starts on those days. Also share that plan with your kids, family members neighbours and remember to make accommodation for your pets.
- * On a 'Catastrophic' rated day you should try and leave the night before or early in the morning.
- * You need to have multiple forms of communications ALERT SA App, CFS website, CFS email, other apps, battery powered radio. Also talk to your neighbours, make sure any vulnerable neighbours have a plan and maybe offer to assist if they have no means of transport.
- * Prepare your home, clean your gutters as fires can start with just one ember in a gutter full of leaves, and clear fine fuels away like grasses and shrubs.
- * There are 14 CFS trucks in the Sturt Group and they have to

cover over 12,000 properties in the bushfire risk area, so everyone needs to be responsible.

- * 'Last Minute Refuges' are exactly that; the last option you should consider in an emergency as they will not be pleasant. Blackwood main street is a Bushfire Safer Place.
- * Remember that CFS crews are all volunteers and that they give up their time with families. As well as their time, when they may need to stay and defend their own properties.
- * There is a new Bushfire Resilience rating app that you can do which assesses your risk, and gives you tips on how you can better prepare your home, you can go to: www.rbcouncil.org to check it out.

And in November another forum was held at the Upper Sturt Soldiers Memorial Hall, organised by the Upper Sturt CFS and Ironbank CFS, once again supported by Waite MP, Catherine Hutchesson.

Over 65 people attended what was a focussed event on these high risk areas including the risks of living on the north facing slope of the Belair National Park.

Catherine and her team will be putting together a 'bushfire information kit' which will include some of the resources that were available at the forums, as well as some practical tips and information.


