# New Council by-law passed to keep cats indoors

THE decision to introduce a new council by-law to keep cats indoors from January 2024 has been met with general support from the community.

Effective from 1 January 2024, new 24/7 confinement controls will apply for all cats born after 1 January 2024 that are registered with the Council, and any new cats to the area that are registered with the Council on or after 1 January 2024.

Council staff will undertake a high level of education and awareness to maximise voluntary compliance with the adopted by-law, and fines will only be considered for repeat offenders or those that ignore repeated warnings or advice from officers.

Community feedback received was extensive and very detailed in nature.

While 65% of community respondents showed support for cat confinement, the new legislation will only apply to newly purchased and unregistered cats, reflecting a concern that quality of life for those cats already accustomed to roaming, may be diminished.

However, there is a clause in relation to cats creating a nuisance (this is an existing clause on

the current by-law), therefore cat owners must continue to ensure their cats do not create a nuisance to other residents.

The introduction of the new by-law will include a significant education and awareness program in relation to cat confinement.

While some said the new legislation did not go far enough to protect native species, Ms Bev Langley of Cherry Gardens Animal Rescue organisation Minton Farm stated that it was a positive development.

"There was a compromise to delay two years. That was the compromise needed to get the two-thirds majority vote in the chamber, to change a bylaw," said Bev.

"This will get us started rather than having to reconsult on a stronger option and is only fair for cat owners to prepare."

Bev has long been a strong supporter of cat confinement, and sees the outcome of irresponsible pet ownership first hand. "The Adelaide Hills area hosts so many cats, and they do the highest percentage of wildlife damage that we receive," she said.

Residents speaking out on social media also shared their support for the measures.

*An first important step. Hopefully with more*

*education of the impact of unrestrained cats owners will be more willing to voluntarily manage their pets in the nearer future,"* posted one person.

Another posted, *Brilliant outcome and totally unexpected. I have simply come to expect procrastination and fence sitting on decisions that are important, divisive and potential vote losers.*

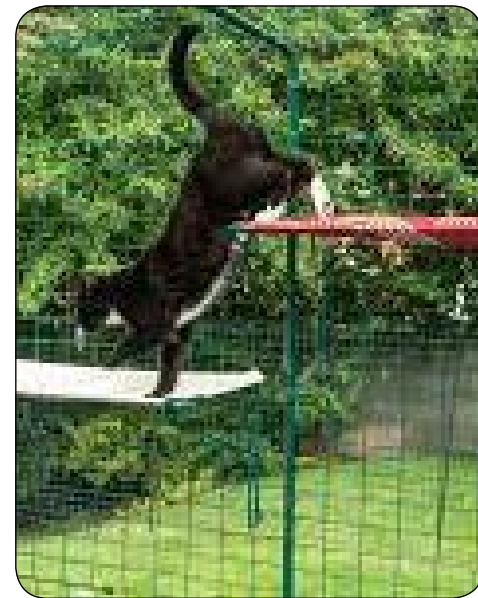
While another posted, *That's great news. I really hope people getting cats between now and then (1/1/24) - and current owners, see the benefits of confinement. Even though they don't have to.*

Others voiced concern that the regulation could provide loopholes for those who choose to ignore their responsibility as pet owners.

*Sadly, the elephant in the room with this bylaw is the use of the term "registered cats" in this council ... will you see a decline in registration or no registration at all? which means very difficult to "police". A beginning but has big holes in it.*

And another posted, *This may add to the numbers of unsexed cats. If you desex you must microchip. So I fear community members will not desex to avoid this."*

Residents are reminded that the restriction



does not mean that cats must stay indoors, as long as they are confined to the owner's property; and that cat runs and enclosures (see above) are an excellent solution to provide added quality of life for your cat, without worry that they might wander. □

# Hub name must celebrate coming together

THE naming of the new Blackwood Hub & Community Library building will go back to community consultation, after the name "Kumangka" was deemed unsuitable by the Kurna Yerta Aboriginal Corporation, due to its usage in other places.

Mitcham Mayor, Dr Heather Holmes-Ross, said there was concern that more consultation needed to take place before a decision was made. "At a recent Council meeting, Cr Lindy Taueber had moved that we should go to consultation again, but that part of the motion became void, because we received word prior to the meeting, that we would not receive approval to use the name Kumangka," explained Heather.

"What happened was, some of the Aboriginal people we were working with, suggested that Kumangka was a good name as it means community gathering place, and so we went to consultation not knowing how much community support there would be for a Kurna name.

"The response we received overwhelmingly supported using a Kurna name, so we then went to the Kurna Yerta board, and they said that because that name has been used for several other places that it wasn't appropriate."

Cr Taueber's motion stated that she sought to deliver a response to both the continual flow of emails from residents expressing concern that they were not aware of the consultation around the naming of the Blackwood Community Hub and their wish to participate, and new information around where this consultation was and was not promoted.

"At the time of Council making the naming decision (14 June 2022), it was not considered, that the consultation was not promoted in *The Blackwood Times*, nor in the hard copy of the Mitcham Community News, nor in the Library blurb newsletter or to the regular users of the Blackwood Community Centre," said Cr Taueber.

"Providing an opportunity for all residents to contribute to the consultation is appropriate."

Uncle Tamaru Kartinyeri (Karrl Smith) Kurna Elder, Co-Chair of the Blackwood Reconciliation Group and Native Title Signatory also considered the consultation to be inadequate: "I do think the decision is a bit rushed. There needs to be more consultation on the naming of the space Blackwood Community Hub as to help Council staff and Mitcham residents understand why Kurna lan-

guage is used, and how to pronounce the word correctly. For in the future, this will greatly help Councils RAP (Reconciliation Action Plan) journey with transparency.

"You have my support for more public consultation with language workshop or a community round table meeting to openly discuss the topic."

While the decision on naming has been prolonged, Council passed a motion to continue honouring Ivor Symons, whom the current Blackwood Library is named after.

Ivor Symons, a City of Mitcham Alderman and Councillor 1940-1970, was a significant State wide advocate for free libraries. Symons and his colleagues' advocacy was rewarded when the Elizabeth Library opened in 1957. Mitcham Council entered the public library ranks in 1960 with the opening of the Mitcham Memorial Library.

In 1973, the Blackwood Library was opened and named the Ivor Symons Library in recognition of this advocacy.

"Prior to his work, libraries were part of institutions and you had to pay to access their catalogues, and he was instrumental in making that change," Heather said.

"We would like to continue to honour his work, though the building will not be named for him, but it may be that the Library collection within the Community Hub retains his name, or he will be honoured in some way within the building."

The Kurna Yerta board have provided a consultant to come up with some other options for the name. "Our administration have had their first meeting with them, and they will come back to council with a range of suggestions which will then be taken out for community consultation again," said Heather.

"We want the name to celebrate what that building is, and it is a coming together, a community building which builds knowledge and friendship, so we would like to see that reflected in the name. Alternatively, we are unaware if there is a Kurna locality name for the area, so that could be something that is pitched."

The preference of Kurna people is that if there is a dual name, then it means the same in both languages. So it would have been unlikely that 'Blackwood Hub Kumangka' would be the name because they don't mean the same thing.

## Local shoppers keep businesses going

"SUPPORTING our local businesses to do well, is important to me and the Malinauskas State Government," said local MP Catherine Hutchesson.

"Especially as business owners grapple with the after effects of the Covid pandemic and the squeeze it is placing on consumers.

"So last month, with the Minister for Small and Family Business, the Hon. Andrea Michaels MP, I hosted a 'Waite Women in Business Breakfast' in the Co. Gallery at Bellevue Heights.

The breakfast was an opportunity for the Minister to hear firsthand from some of the local business owners about their sentiments, experiences and the support they feel they need going forward.

The Minister gave the group a briefing about the recent launch of the Office for Small and Family Business (OSFB). This specialised unit will coordinate State Government policies and programs to support and strengthen South Australia's \$40b small and family business sector.

One of the first items on the OSFB agenda is the development of a Small Business Strategy for South Australia – the first of its kind in more than a decade.

"A whole-of-state Small Business Survey is now open and I encourage all of our local business owners to take this opportunity to share what is happening in their businesses and where support is required," added Catherine.

Other Government Support was also discussed, including our 'Women in Business Program' which will provide upskilling and support, to build resilience and strengthen innovative female-owned businesses in South Australia.

"Going forward, we are looking to meet again and invite others to join us. These women made it very clear that locals keep their businesses going. Shopping local where you can, not only helps the businesses, but it boosts our local economy. It provides jobs for locals and students," explained Catherine.

"In fact, my first job was at the Blackwood Fitness Centre, closely followed by time as a waitress at the Belair Bhavan Indian Restaurant.

"Being able to work locally as a young person made things easier for my parents, and began my engagement with our local community. I still see people today, that remember me from those roles.

"I will also be supporting our local businesses with a 'Business of the

# Do you know where this is?

IN 2022, the Blackwood Action Group (BAG) is taking a different approach with its monthly article, planning to encourage awareness of our local heritage. Under the title "Do you know where this is?"... each issue of The Blackwood Times will feature a photograph of a

local historic site. Readers are challenged to find its location, and thereby have a chance to win a prize.

The actual location will then be revealed in the following issue, and a brief description of the site and history.

THANKS to the people who entered last month's hidden sites competition ... the winners' names will be posted on the BAG website. Information about the location and history of the site that was published in the August 2022 edition follows ...

Last month's image was of the sculpture of the ship *Vyner Brooke* by Iguana Creative, Adelaide and is located at the Women's Memorial Playing Fields (WMPFs). It honours those who perished on and after the sinking of the *SS Vyner Brooke* during World War 2.



On 12 February 1942, *Vyner Brooke* was one of the last ships carrying evacuees, to leave Singapore. She sailed south heading for safety with around 200 passengers, most of them women and children. Among the passengers were the last 65 Australian nurses in Singapore.

On 14 February, the *Vyner Brooke* was attacked by Japanese aircraft and within half an hour rolled over and sank. Approximately 150 survivors eventually made it ashore at Bangka Island, after periods of 8-65 hours in the water.

Bangka Island had already been occupied by the Japanese and most of the survivors were taken captive.

Of the 65 nurses on board, 12 were lost at sea. 22 of the remaining 53 who survived the sinking were washed ashore on Radji Beach, Bangka Island and surrendered to Japanese soldiers.

Most of the nurses were wearing the Red Cross sleeve band and all were in uniforms of some sort that made it clear they were nurses. They assumed that they would be treated as prisoners of war in accordance with the Geneva Convention. They were wrong.

The Japanese soldiers told the Australian nurses to walk into the water and stand in a row facing the sea. They were machine gunned from behind. All died except Sister Vivian Bullwinkel who was wounded.

After hiding in the jungle for about 10 days, Sister Bullwinkel gave herself up when villagers became afraid of the Japanese and stopped giving her small amounts of food. She hid the bullet hole in her dress with her cloth bag and managed to survive another three and a half years in various Japanese prison camps.

The 31 other surviving *Vyner Brooke* nurses, who had drifted ashore elsewhere, had been assembled in Muntok as prisoners of war with around 600 other prisoners. There were a number of wounded amongst the prisoners and the Australian nurses cleared a dormitory to use as a hospital and began treating patients. They had no idea what had happened to their comrades and assumed they had drowned.

Then Sister Bullwinkel arrived. She told the Australian nurses what had happened and they were all sworn to secrecy so that



the Japanese would not be aware that there was a witness to the atrocity.

In 2022, along with the upgrades to the WMPFs, the memorial precinct was enhanced by several sculptures to place the nurses' sacrifice and service more prominently at the site. The WMPFs (cnr Shepherds Hill/South/Ayliffes Roads) are open to the public every day with nearby on-street parking.

# Oval facility build hits funding hurdle

RISING costs have put the development of a new changeroom and community facility at Hawthorndene Oval in jeopardy.

Coromandel Valley Ramblers Cricket Club have been working with Mitcham Council for nine years to construct a new changeroom facility at Hawthorndene Oval.

After years of consultation between Council, the club, and local residents, a decision to build a change room and toilet facility at the site was approved in September, 2021, which would be licensed to

Coromandel Valley Ramblers Cricket Club for certain times and hired out to the community for their use outside of these times.

However, with the rising cost of building supplies over the past year, total project costs were in the order of \$400,000 over the available budget of \$897,000.

With no additional funding currently available for the project, Mitcham Council resolved to extend the project deadline, reflecting the wishes of the club.

"We have decided that we will give the club more time, until the end of 2023 to find more funding. We haven't committed to any fur-

ther funding, we have just given more time," said Mitcham Mayor, Dr Heather Holmes-Ross.

Heather noted that the design of the project was unable to be amended to reduce costs. "It is a minimal build anyway; it's only change-rooms and toilets, so there was no way to scale the design back to reduce costs.

"We have already committed money, and that remains a commitment of Council, so the club now have more time to try and pursue other avenues to apply for additional funding grants."

Since being notified of the funding shortfall, the Club have been in

contact with various Members of Parliament seeking their support in funding the shortfall of the project.

While the Club have not received a further funding commitment to date, they have stated that there have been some promising discussions particularly with State Government.

Council administration contacted the Office for Recreation, Sport and Racing (ORSR) to discuss the possibility of the Club receiving another grant extension for the \$406,000 State Government funding.

The advice received was that this would be the project's third variation and would require the Minister's approval. When consider-

ing whether to approve they would be taking into consideration whether or not they are confident that this project will be able to commence in the timeframe specified, which is currently uncertain.

If the approval for an extension was not granted and the project did lose the external funding currently secured from the State, this would leave only \$491,000 of Council and Club funding remaining for the project and therefore would not be enough to deliver the project.

The Club are aware of the risks associated with this option and they are optimistic that further funding will be sourced. □

# Bollards installed will help keep pedestrians safe

MANY motorists using the Blackwood roundabout may have noticed the recent installation of safety bollards along the north-eastern perimeter of the roundabout.

This project came about after sustained requests over a number of years from local residents who were concerned about safety when using the walkways and public spaces surrounding the roundabout.

Blackwood resident Carolyn Edwards took up the fight when she recognised the danger of using footpaths adjacent to the busy road corridor.

"This all started nearly three years ago when my daughter's mother-in-law (Julie), walked with me along the brand new footpath across the grass verge on the then new Blackwood roundabout," said Carolyn.

"Julie stated she would ... 'rather walk in the mud by the side of the shops, than use the new footpath and risk getting killed by an out of control car speeding around the roundabout'.

"So I started to photograph cars on the roundabout heading straight for me on the footpath! Even a Council workman fixing the water fountain one day, said he just wanted to leave before he got killed!"

Carolyn took Julie's comments on board and the idea was born to campaign for safety bollards on the roundabout.

"In March 2020, I had a letter from our then MP Sam Duluk, saying that the Liberal State Government had agreed safety bollards were an urgent necessity. However, in September 2020,

without notice, the State Government cancelled everything and hand-balled it over to Mitcham Council instead.

"I did not find this out until much later when I decided to take the issue up with the Council, and their works department knew nothing and nothing had been done.

"It was not until one day I saw a grandmother, with a baby in a pusher and their dog sitting in the sun on seats outside the Save the Children Shop, that I realised something urgently needed to be done," explained Carolyn.

"So I approached Mitcham Council Mayor about the issue and Heather very kindly escalated my request. Latterly, I also received help from our new Labor MP for Waite, Catherine Hutchesson who also escalated the issue.

"And earlier this month (August), I could not believe my eyes when I saw the safety bollards being installed. Now we can all safely use the footpath."

Mayor Holmes-Ross said the bollards had received funding in the 2021/22 Budget, but had been delayed due to a backlog of construction projects.

"We have been limited in the speed with which we can roll projects out due to Covid, but the plans were in place," said Heather.

"If people feel safer walking in the community then that's a great service. This was not something that had been on Council's radar previously, so it's great that members of our community can voice their concerns, and have them enacted through local government."

While MP for Waite, Catherine Hutchesson said she had relayed the requests to Mitcham Council to forward the works.

"It is great to see that the bollards are now in place. This will protect pedestrians as well as anyone spending time on that small park, should a vehicle veer off course whilst navigating the roundabout," Catherine said.

"Making Blackwood more pedestrian friendly is important and I am glad to see this improvement.

"I am always happy to listen and discuss concerns residents have about our local area and do what I can to seek improvements.

"Thank you to Mitcham Council for installing the bollards." □

Our newly elected Federal Government have certainly inherited a very real monster in relation to climate change and its catastrophic by product, the decimation of insects worldwide.

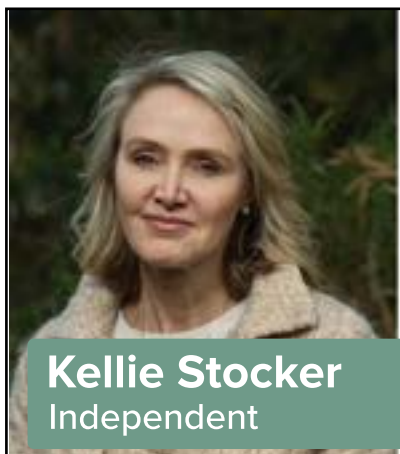
Continued life on Planet Earth will now be in the hands of politicians and scientists across the world to deal with. They have a monumental task ahead of them.

## Men not proactive enough with their health

WITH Father's Day celebrated on the first Sunday in September, skin cancer experts are urging Australian males to spend more time checking the health of their skin.

Skin Cancer College Australasia CEO, Lynette Hunt, said that in a country with the highest rates of deadly skin cancers in the world, Father's Day was a timely reminder for all Australians to look after their Dads.

Data from the 2022 Cancer Data Report released by the Australian Institute of Health and Wellbeing (AIHW) in July this year shows that in 2022, Australian men are almost 50 per cent more likely to be diagnosed with extremely dangerous skin cancers compared to women.

"Unfortunately, the harsh reality is that men are just not proactive enough when it comes to prioritising their health," Ms Hunt said.

"Many men only see their doctor about their skin when prompted by a female partner or relative, so we really do need family members to think about Dad and his skin.

"Men of a certain age, often say it's too late for them to start wearing a hat or sunscreen. In fact it's never too late to start wearing a hat, and it's never too late for a skin check.

"We are encouraging all Australians to go to [scanyourskin.org](http://scanyourskin.org) so they can understand the risk they have of developing skin cancer and where to go for help."

Ms Hunt said the AIHW report also shows a clear correlation between early diagnosis and survival beyond five years for those diagnosed with melanoma of the skin.

"The AIHW data shows the two-year survival rate for men with melanoma declines markedly the later the stage of the disease at diagnosis," Ms Hunt said.

"The two-year survival rate for men diagnosed with early or stage 1 melanoma is 99.9 per cent.

"At Stage II, this drops to 84.9 per cent, at Stage III it's 79.9 per cent, but only 35.7 per cent of men survive a Stage IV diagnosis after two years."

Ms Hunt said men aged 60-64 have the poorest survivability of any age group up to age 70. If diagnosed with Stage II melanoma, this group has a 32.9 per cent mortality rate within five years.

"These statistics are startling and really do show the need for prevention in the first place but also for continual vigilance when it comes to conditions of the skin," Ms Hunt said.

S.C.A.N. your skin

Skin Cancer College Australasia recommends that while it's a doctor's job to diagnose skin cancer, consumers themselves are best placed to notice any changes in their skin which warrants investigation.

On the website [www.scanyourskin.org](http://www.scanyourskin.org) the College advises how often to see a doctor for a full-body skin check and how often to run their own personal skin checks based on their personal risk factors as identified by the easy-to-use risk assessment tool on the website.

When conducting your own skin check, skin cancer professionals recommend you SCAN for anything that is:

- Sore,
- Changing,
- Abnormal, or
- New

Sore means a spot which is sore (scaly, itchy, bleeding, tender) and doesn't heal within 6 weeks.

Changing is a spot which is changing in size, shape, colour or texture.

Abnormal looks different, feels different, or

stands out when compared to your other spots and moles.

New has appeared on your skin recently. Any new moles or spots should be checked, especially if you are over 40.

Skin Cancer College Australasia has developed an easy to use tool so all consumers can determine their risk of developing skin cancer for themselves and their loved ones.

The tool, available at [www.scanyourskin.org](http://www.scanyourskin.org) also helps consumers find a doctor trained and qualified to detect potentially serious skin cancers.

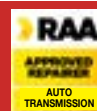

## Many households still getting recycling wrong

FOR many households, confusion and misconceptions about the recycling process can be barriers towards proper recycling practices.

Are you one of the 42% of Aussies who are incorrectly putting polystyrene in the kerbside recycling bin? Or the 18% who are still bagging their recycling?

specialised soft plastics recycling bin such as those provided in selected supermarkets. This means your chip packets, plastic bags and any other scrunchable plastics do not belong in the kerbside recycling bin. Try RedCycle instead!

### 4. That old phone can be recycled, just not in your kerbside bin

Every year, 44.7 million tonnes of e-waste is generated around the world – containing up to US\$65 billion worth of raw materials like gold, silver and platinum.

The amount of global e-waste is expected to increase by almost 17% to 52.2 million tonnes in 2022, or around 8% every year. In Australia, e-waste is also the fastest-growing component of the municipal solid waste stream.

## Our homes are energy guzzlers

RESEARCH undertaken by the University of South Australia has indicated that most of Australia's houses are poorly designed with inadequate insulation in their roofs and walls, and windows facing the wrong directions and not shaded from the summer sun.

While new houses are required to meet a 6.0 star energy rating, the university research concluded that most older houses have a rating of between 1.5 and 3.0, requiring up to four times as much energy as necessary to heat or cool them inside.

Our houses have never been designed to cope with extreme hot or cold weather, in fact not even for mildly hot or cold weather. We have become very dependent on air conditioning to make us comfortable, using lots of energy and costing lots of money.

Then there is the silly current trend of dark coloured roofs that add at least 20% to the heat load in summer.



Despite new houses having to meet a 6.0 star energy rating, it is possible to achieve this while still having minimal insulation, windows catching the summer sun and dark roofs.

Project home builders won't change their designs because they are happy with the status quo. Governments are reluctant to change the rules and standards, because they have been cowed by the industry to believe that requiring better environmental performance will cost too much, and that this also restricts freedom of choice.

Most comparable European countries have much higher building standards for environmental performance of housing than we do in Australia.

Australian homes are "energy guzzlers compared to those built to higher standards overseas," according to the Climate Council.

Each year Sustainable House Day showcases homes that have been designed and renovated to be energy efficient. I have been regularly impressed by how comfort conditions can easily be provided.

Sometimes it can be done just using basic passive design principles and sometimes using clever technologies; more often with a mix of both.

Sustainable House Day normally happens in September, but this time it will be next March, with lead-up events over coming months.
