Historic building being restored at forest

THANKS to a group of dedicated volunteers, a part of Blackwood's horticultural history is getting a much-needed renovation.

The heritage listed stone building on the Blackwood Forest Reserve Recreation Park (corner Main Road and Turners Avenue, Hawthorndene) has recently had a new roof, and work will be commencing on the interior soon.

Built in 1908 from locally sourced quarried stone, the building was the office for the Blackwood Experimental Orchard: the main experimental and training facility for horticulture central South Australia until the 1960s.

"Around 4000 different fruit trees were planted here to be tested under different techniques for spraying, fertilising etc," explains Debbie Reynolds a member of The Friends of Blackwood Forest Recreation Park, the volunteer group heading up the renovations.

The orchard was eventually closed down in the 1970s and when the land was earmarked for development, the local community fought hard to keep it as 'open space'.

In 2013, the Department of Environment

Water and Natural Resources who owns the land, gave The Friends of Blackwood Forest Recreation Park permission to renovate and use the historic Orchard Manager's Office building.

"Funds have been raised through a crowd funding campaign, other donations and a lot of sausage sizzles," explains Debbie. "The Mitcham City Council also contributed \$1,000 to the reroofing through its Heritage Subsidy Scheme

Volunteers have worked hard scraping back and painting the old roofing timbers (bargeboards) and with the help of local businesses such as Hilltop Roofing and Blackwood Hire, most of the roof has now been repaired.

The group is now looking to renovate the interior including a new floor, replastering the walls, repairing windows and replacing glass.

"Our many thanks go to the generous dona tions and the in-kind support from several local businesses who have helped so far," says Debbie.
"However, the next round of renovations are

going to require more donations, more grantapplication writing and more sausage sizzles, but the results will be worth the wait and this muchloved building will get the makeover it richly

Many people enjoy walking through the forest, from parents with their children to those walking their dogs.

Lowest council rate increase for over a decade

HERE'S some good news for a change for City of Mitcham ratepayers, with Council deciding to increase rates by just 2.75 percent, making it one of the lowest rate increases for residents for over a decade.

The average residential rate will increase from \$1,567 to \$1,611 an increase of just \$44 per annum or 85 cents per week.

Some new and improved services for the Blackwood area include the installation of new footpaths; expansion of the Tree Planting Program to 1,200 trees per annum; a new and upgraded stormwater infrastructure; further development of the Sturt River Linear Trail and partnering with the Federal Government to deliver a much needed replacement of the Hewett Reserve Clubrooms

Upgrades to some of the playgrounds and other sporting facilities in the area have been included in the budget, together with renovations to buildings such as Blackwood Community Centre in Young Street, and the Belair Scout and Guide halls.

'This budget reflects our commitment to the community, to not only keep rates low but to also maintain and improve services, while strengthening Council's financial position. The rate increase of 2.75% is the lowest for over a decade," says Mayor

Glenn also highlights the recently announced increase in the Solid Waste Levy by the State Government, an unexpected increase of 22.6 per cent, was an unbudgeted expense for Council.

"We will need to give careful consideration as to how to manage the impact of this increasing levy on our budgets over the next 12 months," he says.

Tragic death of local teens who

paid ultimate price

A CENTURY ago, families in the local area were becoming acclimatised to the losses of men from the Gallipoli campaign of 1915 when the harsh realities of the Western Front were brought home to them.

The relentless artillery shelling, gas, machine-gun fire and trench warfare conditions were to become new ways of life for the ANZACS who arrived in France in June 1916 to do their bit as part of the AIF's involvement in France and Belgium.

All too soon, many of these men were to become fatalities in horrendous battles that have become part of the folk-lore of many Australian families since then.

Fromelles and Pozieres saw the loss of almost 28,000 Australians in the short space of 6 weeks from July to late August 1916.

Whilst Pozieres has been synonymous with Australians' involvement on the Somme in 1916, Fromelles has

been almost forgotten until quite recently.

Two local teenagers fell in these battles whose stories need to be told, however briefly.

Alfred George Sinigear (May 1897) and John Lanarch Downer (May 1898) were born within a year of each other and followed closely related paths in life.

Each attended the local Coromandel Valley Public School in the early part of the 20th century and later attended Adelaide High School.

After leaving school, each then found employment in the Elders firm in Adelaide as clerks. With the outbreak of WWI in 1914, both boys were still mid-teenagers.

By June 1915, Alf Sinigear had pressured his parents into signing a letter giving permission to enlist in the armed forces as at 18, he was under-age without parental consent. Family lore has it that he had threatened to enlist under a false name should they refuse. He embarked for

overseas service as a member of the 32nd Batt in December 1915.

While Jack Downer enlisted for service in the AIF with his brother in January 1916 as a 17 year old, having lied about his age. He was drafted to D Company of the 50th Battalion and left for overseas service in April 1916.

Following their arrival in Egypt, both Alf Sinigear and Jack Downer saw battalion training prior to being sent to France via Marseilles.

With the commencement of the battle of The Somme in July 1916, Australian troops were sent north to re-inforce Allied forces and were soon engaged in horrendous battles.

The 32nd Batt was part of the attack in broad daylight by the 5th Division at Fromelles in July which saw 5,544 casualties within 24 hours, these being the worst endured by the Australian Army in its entire history.

Amongst those casualties was Corporal Alfred Sinigear, aged 19, whose body was never found and whose name is listed on the VC Corner memorial at Fromelles.

Less than a month later, in August, the 50th Batt was engaged at Pozieres in a futile attempt to take Mouquet Farm, a heavily fortified German

position. This battle had raged since mid-July and saw Australian Divisions rotated exhausted.

Here, Jack Downer was killed, barely 18 years of age, in his first battle. As with Alf Sinigear, his body was never found.

A fellow Coromandel Valley soldier, Alf Watchman also died here.

In life and in death, Alf Sinigear and Jack Downer followed each other. The tragedy of their deaths is just a

small part of the price paid by countless families during WWI.

They have no known resting places but are re-united amongst their comrades on the Blackwood War Memorial near the Blackwood roundabout

Member resigns from Park Ward forcing election

FOLLOWING the resignation of Cr Mark Ward as an Elected Member of the City of Mitcham in May this year, nominations for candidates for The Park Ward's supplementary election are now n until 11 August.

Residents can expect to receive their ballot material for the election towards the end of the month with close of voting 12noon on Monday 12 September.

Councillor Ward expressed his immense privilege in serving the Mitcham community and congratulated Council on its commitment to placing Mitcham in a strong position for the future.

Mayor Glenn Spear said, "Councillor Ward was held in high regard with Council and within our community, and his valued contribution will be greatly missed.

'I thank Councillor Ward for his positive and enthusiastic approach to the role of Councillor for The Park Ward over the past 10 years."

City of Mitcham Council confirmed the cost of the supplementary election will be approximately \$35,000.

This includes \$25,000 for the services of the Electoral Commission of South Australia in conducting the election and a provision of \$10,000 to cover additional costs associated with the supplementary election incurred by the City of

Mitcham," a spokesperson said. Cr Ward resigned from Council in May to devote his full attention to representing his com-munity at a federal level.

He was first elected to Council in 2006 and had worked on a number of key issues, such as Chairing the Rail Freight Committee as well as being involved with many local sporting clubs and community committees.

First female member to be elected in Boothby seat

ALTHOUGH not formally announced by the Australian Election Commission at time of print. Boothby is likely to have its first female

She attracted over 40 percent of the vote

25 percent, and Xenophon Team candidate Karen Hockley who attracted over 20 percent. Green candidate Jane Bange attracted 8.3 percent while the Independent candidates attracted 5 percent of the vote.

The Liberals have held Boothby since 1949. and retiring MP Andrew Southcott was the Federal member for the past 20 years.

"If elected as the Member for Boothby, I will continue to listen to residents and be a strong voice for the community on the issues that matter locally," Nicolle says.

Local Liberal electoral promises included \$43 million to extend the Tonsley rail line to Flinders Medical Centre, and \$400,000 allocated for upgrades to Hewett Oval sports clubrooms on Coromandel Parade

Nicolle has also promised to lobby for improving local traffic issues such as the Blackwood roundabout, and to lobby for the rail freight line to be re-routed.

In other areas, she has promised to look after our local environment through providing solar panels to community groups, and green army projects, and delivering the NBN rollout.

In the Blackwood and surrounding areas, nbn™ told Blackwood Times, customers who want to connect to the nbnTM are not charged installation fees by the nbn™ but a customer will need to order a plan through one of the 120 retail service providers operating in the area.

confirmed once a customer has ordered their monthly plan from a nbn™ retailer, the retailer will contact nbn™ and ask for the customer's nbn™ service to be switched on.

"The cost of switching on is free of charge to the customer," confirmed an nbn™ spokesman. "However, a retailer may charge the customer for a new modem and they may charge to come to your house to install it. While some people get the option of self install and choose to do it themselves.

You can keep your home phone number. However, nbn™ advises to confirm with your provider they will keep your phone number, when you transfer your service to the nbn™ network

Once connected, customers pay their retailer for the cost of the package they choose.

Unique tree festival launched start of Christmas season



FROM 1960 to 1980 Blackwood held a 'Festival of Christmas Trees' to celebrate the start of the festive

Originally, the impetus came from the Blackwood CWA headed by Tina Fairbrother. In its first year, the Festival attracted 135 entries which were displayed in the Blackwood Memorial Hall on Coromandel Parade. Lady Playford opened the Festival while displays appeared on local TV, such was the

Over £100 was taken at the door roughly representing 1,400 adults and children attending over 3 days. Prize money was made available by local businesses and proceeds were in aid of Father Adelaide Christmas

A tradition was underway whereby our beloved Blackwood Christmas Pageant ended at the Memorial Hall and Santa would leave his sleigh and take up residence in a 'Magic Cave'.

The community enjoyed a mag-nificent spectacle of decorated trees with Ainslee Roberts' Nativity scene an annual feature. Not only were Christmas trees on display - you could see decorated bottles (including a 1962 entry by the Blackwood Golf Club featuring nuts, bolts, washers and things all gilded and glued), table centrepieces (1964 saw a white lace stocking with baubles and streamers), hostess aprons, mantle piece decorations, wreaths, floral card designs and more.

But it was the trees that were the '...The individual exhibits were unbelievably beautiful...There were many traditional trees - heavy laden with bright and lovely orna ments and gaily lit...'(21 Dec 1962 The Coromandel), a spectacular tree of a dry wattle hung with dozens of thin gold streamers, a cone covered with rosettes made from tinted tissues called 'Christmas in the bathroom' while a bird cage tree also featured.

Lesleyann Fairbrother recalled 'first using Epsom Salts around the trees for snow, then Mum had a contact with Iplex Plastics and we were able to get plastic off cuts'.

Entrants came from schools, Floral Art Clubs, the Labour Council, Wanda Boys Home, Apex and Lions Clubs, Girl Guides, the Good Neighbour Counsel and many creative individual community members. 'For many... the exhibits represent a whole year's work, the fulfilment of a dream, an idea brought to life...' (Dec 1972)

In 1973 the Blackwood Apex Club took over the management of the festival bringing their own ideas to ...stalls will include cold drinks, ice cream, a barbecue..., fairy

floss and donuts. A merry-go-round will also be available. Christmas carols will be sung by visiting choirs and Christmas music will be played by courtesy of Blackwood Sound Centre... an art and craft fair will feature...' (Hills Gazette 1 Dec 1976)

Now, some 36 years later after the last 'tree festival' was held, a number of community organisations have united and would like to bring back this unique event.






