





Reconfigure council assets to spark retail resurgence

AN update report on the much talked about strategic investigations affecting Blackwood District Centre

states 'there are no immediate fixes available for Blackwood'.

The report partly blaming Blackwood's 'highly fragmented ownership pattern' and concludes a possible strategic approach may involve 'land swaps and/or the reconfiguration of Mitcham Council's own assets to act as catalysts for change'.

The report also discusses opportunities for higher housing diversity, including higher densities, a 'Movement study' (ie vehicular, cycle and pedestrian) and 'encouraging

uses that are not extant in Blackwood' such as accommodation, entertainment and restaurants above the 'café' level of offering.

Mayor Glenn Spear says his personal view supports the relocation of a library to the community centre site on Young Street, Blackwood. "This has the potential to anchor the central business district", he says.

He suggests further land developments could make a walk-through complex to give the area a 'mall' type atmosphere and it could be funded by selling the current library and nursery site. He stresses any changes would have to be approved by Council.

Blackwood has multiple landowners, and some are more proactive than others at helping rejuvenate the

Despite Council offering to fund the beautification of Telstra's park area with the work carried out by volunteers, Telstra rejected the offer and has refused to open up that area up for public use.

"I was very annoyed with Telstra and it needs more community spirit," says Glenn. "We rely on integrity and goodwill of people working to get a better result.

We need to be working with developing other properties to get this whole thing happening; we have got a vision but it does require people coming together."

While the report suggests higher density living in

the area, Glenn points out State Government has failed to recognise Blackwood as a development area by not elevating it to a primary renewal area and he says he will be approaching Government again on the matter.

Traders have mixed feelings about any redevelopment. While Kohl&Soda owner Emma Hildebrandt thinks development would be good as Blackwood is not

a 'destination' suburb, Dane Sayers from Blackwood Country

Meats has concerns about who would buy Council land.

"I've heard Aldi wants to move into the area," he says. "Blackwood is a community based little town and we already have Woollies, Foodland and Coles and I don't want it to be any tougher."

While parking is an issue, Dane thinks there are alternatives highlighting areas could be worked on such as the Telstra

Glenn says he's excited about Blackwood's potential but it is reliant on people coming together. "Council can facilitate but it's up to the people to say yes," he concludes.

The report was presented to City of Mitcham Council to inform Council of progress and a further report will be presented to Full Council soon to discuss the future opportunities with respect to Council's landholdings.

The Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS) has stated there will be no fines for anyone who didn't manage to complete the Census form on August 9, and you have until 23 September to complete the Census before receiving a \$180 penalty per day.

The 2011 census found the population of Blackwood suburb was 4,053; made up of approximately 51.8% females and 48.2% males. The median/average age in the area was around 44 years of age.

Although 75.3% of people living in Blackwood were born in Australia, our area includes people who were born elsewhere. The other responses for country of birth included England, Scotland, Germany, New Zealand, United States of America, South Africa, Netherlands, Canada, Wales, India, Northern Ireland, Papua New Guinea, Philippines and Ireland.

Most people in Blackwood speak English only, but there is also a small proportion of people speaking German, Italian, Russian, Dutch, Greek, Polish and Cantonese at home.

While nearly 40% stated they had no religious affiliation, the religious makeup of the area includes Anglican, Catholic, Uniting Church, Lutheran, Baptist, Christian, Churches of Christ and Buddhism.

In 2011, Blackwood's unemployment rate was 4.4%. The majority of occupations were professionals, followed by clerical & administrative workers, technicians & trades workers, managers, community & personal service workers, sales workers, labourers, and machinery operators & drivers.

The main industries people from Blackwood work in, are health care and social assistance followed by education and training, public administration, professional, scientific and technical services, retail trade, construction, manufacturing, accommodation and food services, other services.

An equitable spread of quality and functional sports complexes and sports facilities that meet diverse sport, recreation and community needs, based on a planned approach to asset management ... the Strategy will assist Council in future planning, development and management of its sports facilities over the next 10 years.

Council owned sporting facilities in the Blackwood district include Apex Park, Blackwood Bowling Club, Blackwood Community Recreation Centre, Blackwood Hill Oval, Hawthorndene Oval, Hewett Sports Ground, Karinya Reserve and Manson Oval.



Not all doom and gloom as businesses continue to invest

DESPITE high rental rates (higher than Unley and Hyde Park), parking issues and the perceived

ness owners are continuing to work hard and invest in the area they love.

While some businesses have sadly closed their doors and there are some vacant premises, over the past couple of years, we've seen in Blackwood and the surrounding suburbs cafés expand, veterinary clinic's introduce new dog play services, new bakeries and eateries open up and even mobile phone repair shops come to the

problem of a strip-shopping precinct, local busi-

And businesses are continuing to invest in the area and expand to meet customer demand.

When the shop next door in the Woolworths shopping precinct became vacant last year, home and gifts Kohl&Soda owner, Emma Hildebrandt decided to take on the lease.

"Kohl&Soda opened in January 2015; everyone was enjoying the store but we only had room for one clothes' rack," she says. "Customers wanted more clothing for the 30-60 year old market, so in June 2015, we decided to take on the larger space." Now she can offer her customers a whole shop full of clothes!

Meanwhile, Blackwood Hire has invested heavily in building new state-of-the-art premises, and more recently, added a new larger truck

"We've spent a fair bit on new equipment and the new truck will enable us to deliver bigger machinery," explains Ben Quirk, Blackwood Hire manager. He believes consumer confidence is good and with low interest rates, residents are seeing it as a good time to develop their properties. "There's always new equipment to be used,"

Responding to its members' request for more services, Blackwood Fitness is now in Stage 2 of its development.

Stage 1 involved additional consulting rooms now offering physiotherapy, psychologist, exercise physiologist, dietitian and massage therapist services, and a café selling healthy food to eat in and ready-made meals to take home.

"We're investing in our infrastructure to become more modern and evolve and adapt to what people want," says John Pavlis, Blackwood Fitness owner. "People want more and want the Centre to be a one-stop-shop; it's now more of a lifestyle centre than a gym."

Stage 2 involves nine new consulting rooms for other medical and allied health professionals. A 24-hour doctor's surgery and a professional cosmetic consulting service have already confirmed tenancy and John says there will also be added security.

Common in the United States, John says there is an increasing demand for 'lifestyle' centres

with everything under one roof. "Over there they have beauticians and hairdressers too." He says there are similar centres in Sydney and believes once it is completed, Blackwood Fitness with all its additional health-related services, will be the first centre of its kind in South Australia.

This stage is costing around \$350,000, but John believes there is a demand in Blackwood and the Adelaide hills for these types of facilities

Blackwood is also attracting interest from businesses wanting to come into the area.

It's been three years in the waiting, however

Childcare & Early Learning provider Precious Cargo is committed to moving into the building on Shepherds Hill Road once it is completed.

Precious Cargo CEO Cheryl Shigrov explains: "We aren't the land owner and there have been some issues completely out of our control, but we hope to open in February next year."

Cheryl says it will probably cost the organisation between \$350,000-\$400,000 to set up the centre, which will have five classrooms and a garden.

With new families moving into the area, she believes there is a demand for additional childcare centres in the area and highlights they've already got a waiting list. The centre will accommodate around 100 children each day and Cheryl says there will be some employment opportunities, as they'll be looking at having 25-28 staff on site each day.

Tower goes up despite community concerns

THE Telstra tower has now been erected on Hewett Reserve much to the disapproval of the majority of folk in the near community.

The following is a summary of the situation we are now faced with into the future:

- A tower that the majority of the community in this area never wanted
- Micro radiation from a tower which world studies suggest are a risk to pregnant mothers and
- A tower built on reserve land 152+ years old (land gifted by the Hewett family for community use but rezoned by Mitcham Council with minimal community consultation). An alternative site ignored by Council was available.
- Council to take from Telstra an upfront payment then yearly payments for the lease of land to Telstra for 20+ years.
- It is understood Council see this money as being theirs to put in to general revenue.
- It is understood that there are some protective measures that can be taken to limit the extent of radiation from towers. ?? Has that been taken in to account in this situation?
- Perhaps if Council were to insist that Telstra take every possible protective measures to restrict/ blanket the radiation from the tower and direct all monies (upfront payments and ongoing yearly lease arrangements) from Telstra to upgrade and benefit Hewett Reserve then Council might gain a little more respect from this section of the community.

Interestingly, in July 19 'The Advertiser' (page 14) ran an article 'Brighton Tower Approved' despite two thirds of residents and some Brighton Primary School parents opposing the structure.

.... Representatives from Telstra, Optus and industry group Mobile Carriers Forum told councillors at a meeting on July 5 that towers did not damage people's health.

With the increasing number of reports worldwide about the dangers of micro radiation, one wonders whether money is the driving force behind decision making by multinationals etc at the expense of people's health.



Have your say with voting in Park Ward on now

RESIDENTS have a choice of six candidates in City of Mitcham's 'Park Ward' supplementary election being held this month.

Suburbs included in the Park Ward are: Belair (part), Crafers West (part), Coromandel Valley (part), Glenalta, Hawthorndene and Upper Sturt. The candidates are (in alphabetical order by surname): Jane Bange; Peter

Lloyd; Mark Gamtcheff; Kai Leong; Sarah Lush and Jane Silbereisen. The election is being held following the resignation of Cr Mark Ward in May, who resigned from Council to devote his full attention to representing his community at a Federal level. He was first elected to Council in 2006 and had worked on a number of key issues, such as Chairing the Rail Freight Committee as well as supporting many sporting clubs and

community committees.

City of Mitcham Council confirmed the cost of the supplementary election will be approximately \$35,000.

"This includes \$25,000 for the services of the Electoral Commission of South Australia in conducting the election, and a provision of \$10,000 to cover additional costs associated with the supplementary election incurred by the City of Mitcham," a spokesman said.

All voting in Local Government elections is by postal voting and Park Ward residents should have received papers with details of how to vote.



Libraries are essential to suburban and country living



Continuing the series of articles by the History Subcommittee of the Blackwood Action Group about social and recreational activities in the Blackwood area in the past.

WHEN the sailing ship Tam O'Shanter arrived light reading material – mainly westerns and services to country people occurred in 1977, at the Port River on 23 December 1836, the cargo included a large, weighty iron box containing 200 books and pamphlets.

They were intended by the founding fathers of South Australia to provide a library to help educate the citizens of this new, enlightened and progressive society. Unfortunately the box was dropped by the crew of the ship's rowing boat and had to be rescued from the mud.

Between 1836 and 1957 a network of subscription libraries - 306 at its peak in 1930 existed in mechanics institutes across the state including in Coromandel Valley (but not in Blackwood, Belair or Eden Hills).

Alexander Murray subscribed £50 towards the erection of the Coromandel Valley Institute with the library located on the lower level. By the opening day in 1881 there were about 100 volumes in the library, although it was noted that the number of subscribers was small.

Affiliation with the South Australian Institute on North Terrace offered advantages such as the circulation of boxes of books to supplement the local collections of largely

romances - and very limited state government

The Blackwood, Belair and Coromandel Valley Boys' Club which began in Blackwood in 1903 included a subscription library. Older residents also remember being able to borrow books, at a cost, from a shop known as Miss Bullock's Books in Station Road.

The existence of subscription libraries hampered the rights of South Australians to access free public libraries long after their development in other states. From the late 19th century visitors to the city could freely use the resources of the State Library.

Particularly disadvantaged however were country people and children. To address these shortcomings, in the 1940s the State Library established the Country Lending and Children's Country Lending Services which sent parcels of books to individuals in the country (including Blackwood) by train. Children benefited from greatly improved school libraries.

A further step in the provision of library

with the opening at Pinnaroo of the first of more than 50 joint school community libraries across the state and the subsequent demise of

In January 1953, Ivor Symons, a former mayor of Mitcham, organised a delegation to the Premier requesting an Act for subsidised free libraries. Premier Playford's reply was instructive: 'nothing is free - somebody has to pay for it'. Fortunately Symons and his colleagues persisted and were rewarded when the Elizabeth Library opened in 1957.

Mitcham Council, in collaboration with the state government, opened the Mitcham Library in 1960 and the aptly named Ivor Symons Library in Blackwood in 1973 on the corner of Shepherds Hill Road and Brighton Parade.

The library soon outgrew this building and in 1981 the Council purchased a former carpet showroom on the corner of Main Road and Carr Street and converted it into a library.

The Blackwood library too has now outgrown its premises as its use grows and changes, reminding us that libraries are indeed
